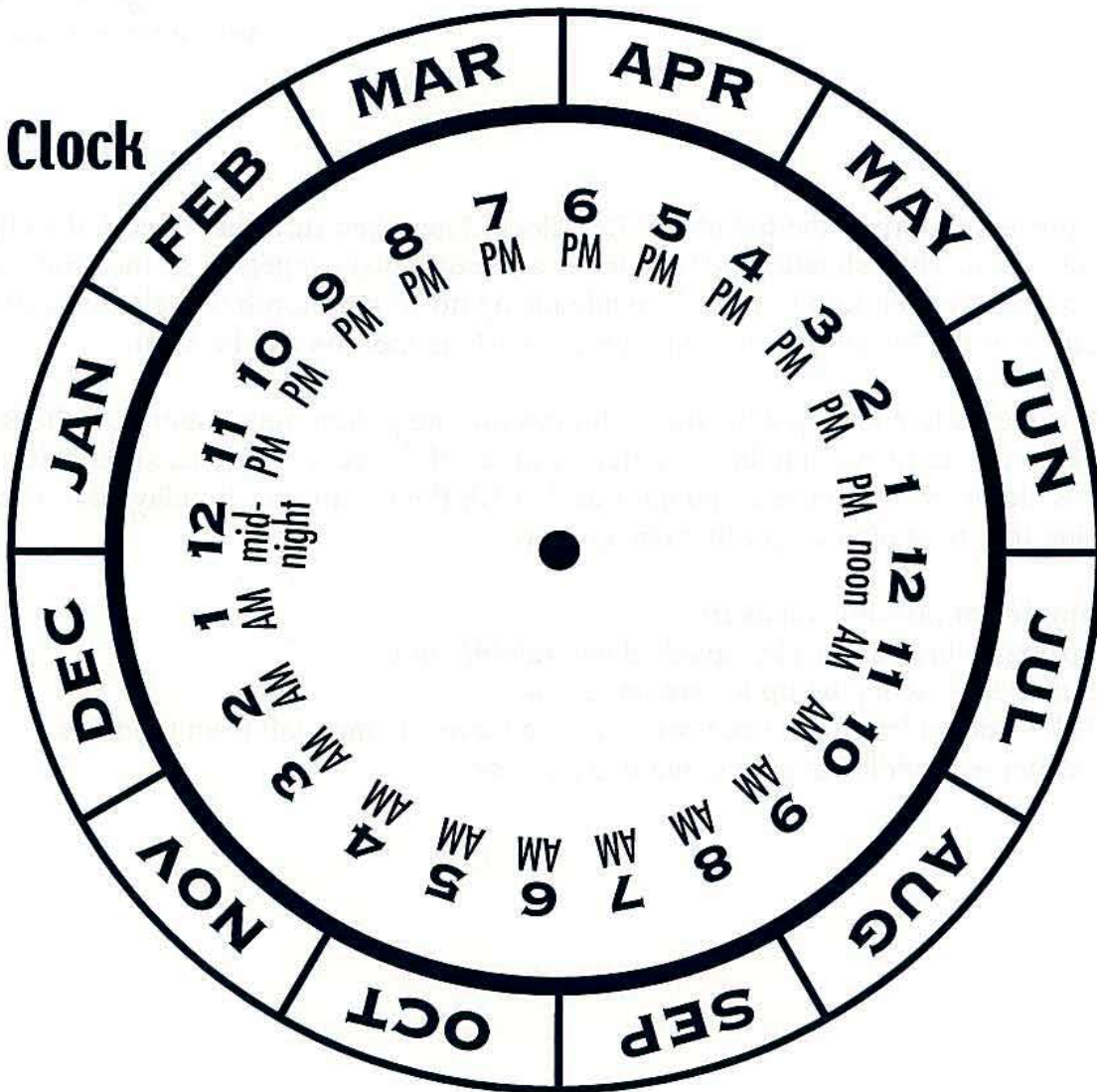


Star Clock



THE TIME IS

The diagram shows the Big Dipper constellation at the top right and the Little Dipper constellation at the bottom. A dashed line extends from the two stars at the end of the Big Dipper's bowl (Mizar and Alkaid) through the North Star (Polaris) to the two stars at the end of the Little Dipper's bowl (Kochab and Phecda). The North Star is marked with a larger circle. The constellation Cassiopeia is shown on the left side.

STAR CLOCK

How To Use Your Star Clock—

- Go outside and find the Big Dipper and North Star.
- Face the North Star.
- Turn the outer circle of the Star Clock so the current month is at the top.
- Turn the inner circle until the picture of the Big Dipper lines up with the Big Dipper in the night sky.
- Read the time in the window. Remember to add an hour if it's daylight saving time.
